



## UCL Report Card 2015

The University Consortium for Liberia (UCL) connects U.S. and Liberia based students, educational institutions, research facilities, and academic professionals. These connections allow each group to advance their community. Despite the devastating impact of Liberia's Ebola crisis, The UCL accomplished much in 2015. With the support of the Embassy of the Republic of Liberia in Washington D.C., The UCL hosted many events and activities that provided *brighter futures through education and understanding*. In 2015, the Joseph N. Boakai, Sr., Vice President of the Republic of Liberia Scholarship Award was launched.

### **Overview**

Established in downtown Atlanta, The UCL has a significant local presence in the Metropolitan Atlanta area. In addition, we have 22 educational partner institutions, seven board members, eight volunteers, and two honorary chairs. Out of the 22 UCL educational partners, 12 are located in the Greater Metropolitan Atlanta area.

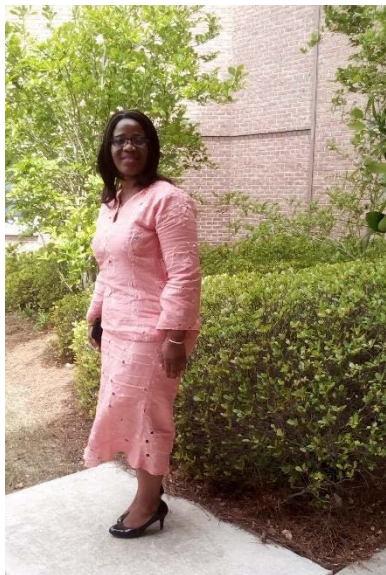

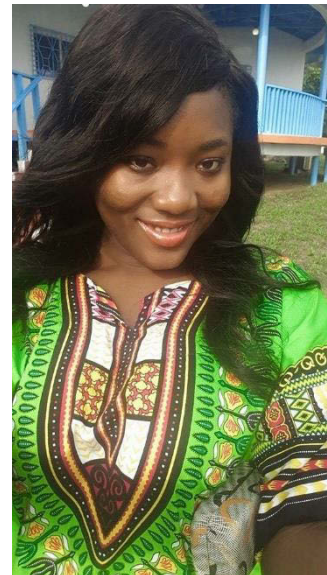
